Hydrangea macrophylla 'Let's Dance Blue Jangles'

- **Use:** The first compact rebloomer, maintaining a tight, neat habit while still forming dozens of flowers on the new wood it produces. Large mop-head flowers turn blue easily under appropriate conditions.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Partial (60-70% of the day) sun is best. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Keep water off leaves. DO NOT PLANT IN FULL SUN! in the South or you will get leaf burn in August and it will wilt on hot days. Large, full flower heads will readily go heavenly blue in acid soils; in alkaline soils, they'll be vivid pink.
- **Growth:** Fast-growing to 2-3 feet high; equal width in only 4 years. Best left unpruned - though they bloom on both old and new wood, you'll enjoy many more blooms over a longer period if you don't prune them except to remove any dead wood in spring, once the new growth has emerged.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5-9 Shrub
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Large heart shaped leaves.
- **Flower:** The only truly compact reblooming hydrangea and blooms on old wood and new wood, so you get more flowers over a longer period from spring to fall.
