The pinks and whites also beautifully complement Roses and other perennials, making Fire

Light™ an excellent source of mid-to-late season color in the back of the border.

Hydrangea paniculata 'Fire Light' / 'SMHPFL'

- **Use:** The new standard to measure all hardy hydrangeas. Upright panicles are packed with florets which transform from pure white in summer to rich pomegranate-pink in late summer to fall. Its thick, sturdy stems hold up the beautiful flowers so they are prominently displayed in the garden. An exceptional landscape shrub for foundation planting, back of the border or cutting garden.
- **Exposure/Soil:** It thrives in morning sun afternoon shade, but also tolerates heat and humidity. **DO NOT PLANT IN FULL SUN!**
- **Growth:** Fast-growing to 6 feet high; equal width in only 3 –4 years. Blooms on new wood so prune in fall or early spring.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-8; Shrub
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Large, dark-green leaves.
- **Flower:** Displays large red and white flower heads in midsummer and blooms reliably regardless of climate. Boasting 12- to 16 -inch blooms held upright on strong red stems that will not droop.
