Hydrangea paniculata 'Fire Light Tidbit'

- **Use:** Thick, sturdy stems help to create a neat, mounded plant that's fantastic in landscapes, flower gardens, even in containers! If you thought you didn't have enough space to grow a beautiful, reliable panicle hydrangea, Fire Light Tidbit® hydrangea is here to help! This innovative new development is the tiniest, tidiest panicle hydrangea yet: it reaches just 2-3' tall and wide, yet it packs in tons of easy-care beauty into its small size. Flowers go from white to rich, saturated tones of pink and red as they age.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Will tolerate full sun unlike other hydrangea types. It thrives in morning sun afternoon shade, but also tolerates heat and humidity.
- **Growth:** Fast-growing to 2-3 feet high; equal width in only 3 –4 years. Blooms on new wood so prune in fall or early spring.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-8; Shrub
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Large, dark-green leaves.
- **Flower:** Big, lush panicles of white mophead flowers appear in early-mid summer, nearly obscuring the textured green foliage. As the summer progresses, they begin to develop bright pink and red tones, which keep it colorful right on up to the first frost, especially combined with its colorful autumn foliage, an unusual trait in panicle hydrangeas.
