

Pink Diamond Hydrangea



**A must have
for every garden!**

Hydrangea paniculata 'Pink Diamond'

- **Use:** An upright rounded Hydrangea with incredibly large flowers. The panicles are held upright, and this large upright habit makes a good background, or it can easily be trained as a small tree. This a rugged, reliable plant and is considered the most cold hardy of this clan.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Partial sun. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Keep water off leaves. DO NOT PLANT IN FULL SUN, unless you want to see leaf burn and water constantly! Most striking color is achieved in acid earth. In neutral soil, both pink and blue flowers appear. With adding lime and elevating the pH they will turn pink. Add Aluminum Sulfate for a deeper blue, but they usually remain blue in our low pH soils without amendment.
- **Growth:** It has a moderate growth to 6 feet tall and as wide.
- **Hardiness:** 3-8; Shrub
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Handsome green and white foliage on boldly branched, mounded form.
- **Flower:** It is first a cream color which gradually turns a rich shade of pink. Cut blossoms are suitable for drying, or prune off in late winter or early spring. The panicles open in late summer with valuable shades of color. It produces both sterile and fertile flowers.
