Hydrangea paniculata 'Tardiva'

- <u>Use</u>: Late season flowers extend garden color into November! Lacy white flowers are tinted pale pink as the season progresses. Award-winning shrub for foundation plantings or encourage it into a tree form as a charming accent. Try it in the border, the foundation, the woodland garden, or even as a specimen. You will be amazed at its beauty and everchanging interest.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Afternoon or dappled shade preferred. Easy to grow in well-drained soil and is more drought tolerant than other hydrangeas. DO NOT PLANT IN FULL SUN, or you will have leaf burn and water constantly!
- **Growth**: Large, well-branched, and vigorous, reaches 6-8 feet high (maybe more with age) and 4 to 5 feet wide within just a few seasons.
- *Hardiness:* 4-9; Shrub
- <u>Foliage</u>: Deciduous. Handsome bright, green foliage on boldly branched, mounded form.
- <u>Flower:</u> A late-flowering (early to late autumn) cultivar with loosely-packed, sharply pointed white flower heads that turn purplish-pink with age.
