

Tardiva Hydrangea



Spectacular in fresh and dried arrangements.

Hydrangea paniculata 'Tardiva'

- **Use:** Late season flowers extend garden color into November! Lacy white flowers are tinted pale pink as the season progresses. Award-winning shrub for foundation plantings or encourage it into a tree form as a charming accent. **Try it in the border, the foundation, the woodland garden, or even as a specimen. You will be amazed at its beauty and ever-changing interest.**
- **Exposure/Soil:** Afternoon or dappled shade preferred. Easy to grow in well-drained soil and is more drought tolerant than other hydrangeas. **DO NOT PLANT IN FULL SUN**, or you will have leaf burn and water constantly!
- **Growth:** Large, well-branched, and vigorous, reaches 6-8 feet high (maybe more with age) and 4 to 5 feet wide within just a few seasons.
- **Hardiness:** 4-9; Shrub
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Handsome bright, green foliage on boldly branched, mounded form.
- **Flower:** A late-flowering (early to late autumn) cultivar with loosely-packed, sharply pointed white flower heads that turn purplish-pink with age.
