

Zinfin Doll Hydrangea



The flowers continue well into fall in most areas, and are, as you can imagine, spectacular in fresh and dried arrangements.



Hydrangea paniculata 'Zinfin Doll'

- **Use:** A unique new hardy hydrangea with loads of beautiful, dense blooms that emerge pure white and then turn bright pink from the bottom up. Flowers eventually age to a dark pink-red, and are a nice addition to the early fall landscape. The color pattern is much like that of Pinky Winky hydrangea, but the panicles are quite full rather than lacy in appearance. Strong stems hold the flowers upright in the garden, and make it an excellent cut flower, too.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Afternoon or dappled shade preferred. Easy to grow in continuously moist, well-drained soil. Butterflies will visit it, and it is very low maintenance, asking only for adequate water. DO NOT PLANT IN FULL SUN, without a
- **Growth:** Large, well-branched, and vigorous, reaches 6 to 8 feet high and 4 to 5 feet wide within just a few seasons.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4-9; Shrub
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Handsome bright, green foliage on boldly branched, mounded form.
- **Flower:** The big white flowerheads open pure white, turn pink at the base, and gradually mature to a rich red by the end of the season.
