Hydrangea quercifolia 'NCHQ1' PPAF

- **Use:** Gatsby Glow Ball oakleaf hydrangea is a compact native shrub with oversized leaves and massive, ball-shaped white flowers that mature to lime green. Its fall foliage is a blend of dramatic burgundies and red tones. This North American native is perfect for low hedges, groupings, or woodland edges
- **Exposure/Soil:** It thrives in morning sun afternoon shade, but also tolerates heat and humidity. DO NOT PLANT IN FULL SUN!
- **Growth:** Fast-growing to 3-4 feet high; equal width in only 3 –4 years. Blooms on old growth, so it is recommended that they be trimmed only immediately after they are finished flowering in the late summer.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5-9; Shrub
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Handsome dark green foliage turns burgundy-red in autumn.
- **Flower:** We also love the crisp, clean white of the blooms which age to a refreshing glowing green color. You have to grow it and see it for yourself to truly appreciate what an improvement it is over other quercifolias.
