Ilex vomitoria 'Bordeaux' / 'Condeaux'

- **Use:** Low growth habit makes this an excellent choice for a low border plant. Small, dark green leaves turn rich, burgundy-red in winter for cool season interest. Adapts to a wide range of cultural conditions, and mixes well in almost any landscape. Drought tolerant.
- **Exposure/Soil:** A sturdy North American native, Yaupon Holly is adaptable to a wide range of cultural conditions, from well-drained to wet, acid to alkaline, and sun to part-shade. Use slow release fertilizer for best results. Water if it hasn't rained in 2 weeks.
- **Growth:** Compact shrub; moderate growing to 3 ft. tall and wide. Over time they could get taller and wider, but are very amenable to pruning.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 7-9, Shrub
- **Foliage:** Evergreen. New growth is dark red. Small, oval, grey-green foliage.
- **Flower:** This cultivar does not produce berries,
