Ilex x latifolia 'Elizabeth Coleman'

- <u>Use:</u> 'Elizabeth Coleman' is a heavy-fruiting llex latifolia hybrid selected by Tom Dodd, Jr. It is more commonly encountered in southern landscapes, but appears hardy well into Zone 6. Vigorous grower with dense branches, it makes an excellent tall screen. Creates an impressive statement in the landscape when planted in groups, used as a large background plant or specimen. Loved for the clusters of berries in the winter!
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Full sun-part shade. Well-drained soil, not soggy. Water the 1st two years for best growth. If it doesn't rain for 7-10 days, then water. For fastest growth use slow release fertilizer in spring and early fall.
- **Growth:** Strong growth 10 to 15 feet tall and 6-10 feet wide.
- Hardiness: Zone 6-9; Shrub
- *Foliage:* Evergreen. Dark evergreen foliage.
- <u>Flower:</u> Bears abundant, large, bright orange-red berries Not known for flowers. Male Chinese hollies are useful planted nearby as pollinizers.
