

Winter Jasmine



**Excellent accent in
the winter garden
for color!**

Jasminum nudiflorum

- **Use:** An heirloom shrub, Weeping Winter Jasmine was introduced from China in the 1840's. This stunning, rarely offered species is noted for its early spring display of bright, non-fragrant yellow flowers and weeping, bright green stems. A great plant for a cascading effect in the landscape for winter color.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Can grow in shade but looks best in a sunny location with a well drained soil. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Grows 3 ft tall and 4-6 ft wide.
- **Hardiness:** 6-10; Shrub
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Bright, glossy, green pinnate leaves divided into 3 oblong leaflets.
- **Flower:** In November the flowers start blooming at the base of the stems and slowly bloom up the stems. By late winter/early spring, it flowers at the tips of the stems.
