

# ReJoyce Coastal Leucothoe



It is a shorter, more heat tolerant type of Leucothoe compared to Margie Jenkins.



## *Leucothoe 'ReJoyce'*

- **Use:** Also known as Mountain Dog Hoble. Looking for something a little more interesting than your common boxwood or holly? Beginning in spring, new leaves erupt in a blaze of red over tidy green mounds. White, urn-shaped flowers form in short clusters on gently arching, yet dense branches, adding a graceful elegance to any setting, whether it be container plantings or your favorite garden path. Deer resistant, eastern native, and it thrives in woodland settings or on slopes with dappled sun making soft textured ferns, woodland grasses and hostas perfect companions. As summer begins to fade, ReJoyce ignites again with the entire plant bursting into autumn colors of deep wine red- persisting through winter. You have to admit...much more interesting than boxwood or holly! Hard to find!
- **Exposure/Soil:** Prefers part sun; moist, well drained soil; dislikes wet sites. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Low mounding shrub 2-3feet tall and 3-4' wide. Wide spreading habit with zig-zag branches.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 6 -9 Shrub
- **Foliage:** Evergreen. Dark green, rounded foliage edged in creamy white. Reddish bronze leaves in the winter.
- **Flower:** Fragrant white flower (2.5" long) clusters in spring.
