

Eleanor Taber Indian Hawthorne



Rhaphiolepis indica 'Conor'

- **Use:** Popular compact evergreen shrub with fragrant clusters of pink flowers during spring and fall. New foliage emerges red then matures dark green in summer. Excellent as a low informal hedge or accent plant for the foundation or mixed borders. Leaf spot resistant.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Grow in full sun for heaviest bloom, but tolerates some shade. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year.
- **Growth:** Moderate growth to 4 feet tall and 3 feet wide.
- **Hardiness:** 7-10, shrub
- **Foliage:** Evergreen New growth is red, maturing into a dark green color.
- **Flower:** Small flowers are fragrant. Pink flowers in spring and then again in fall.
