Rhododendron 'Stonewall Jackson'

- **Use:** "The Confederate Series" was selected from a cross of *Rhododendron austrinum* and *Rhododendron* x 'Hotspur Yellow'. The cross was made by Bob Schwindt; seeds were planted from the plants, and selections were made by Bob himself to make up the popular "Confederate Series" of native azaleas. These azaleas do well in the deep south heat and humidity.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part sun to shade. As with other azaleas, the partial shade of tall trees overhead is the ideal. It will adapt to full-sun sites, though. You just need to water it during times when it isn't raining enough. Grows best in moist, well-drained, organic soils with a pH range from 4.5 to 6.0. "Well-drained" is the key. Planting it in places that don't drain well is a sure death sentence.
- **Growth:** Habit is upright and bushy. Grows 6-10' tall and 5-8' wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5-9 Shrub
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Very lustrous dark green leaves turn orange-bronze in fall. The handsome leaves are exceptionally mildew free.
- **Flower:** Very nice heavy blooming selection of fragrant, large, yellow, orange flowers with red anthers.
