

# Sunbow Solar Flare Native Azalea



With the added attraction of honey-suckle fragrance, these are a perfect addition to your garden.

## *Rhododendron 'Sunbow Solar Flare'*

- **Use:** Brilliant spring-blooming deciduous azaleas with larger, colorful, and more showy blooms. Great for light shade and even sunnier locations.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part sun to shade. Partial shade of tall trees overhead is the ideal. You just need to water it during times when it isn't raining enough. Mulch well to conserve moisture and suppress weeds. Grows best in moist, well-drained, organic soils with a pH range from 4.5 to 6.0. "Well-drained" is the key. Planting it in places that don't drain well is a sure death sentence.
- **Growth:** Vigorous grower to 6 to 8 ft. tall, 4 to 5 ft. wide in an upright habit. The flower buds develop in summer for the following spring's display, so prune shortly after flowering, if necessary. Ideally, plant them where they will not require pruning.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5-9; Shrub
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Leaves up to 4" long, light green leaves.
- **Flower:** Neon yellow blooms with light orange shades in spring; Larger, more showy blooms
