Princess Anne Rose







David Austin roses are prized for their unique combination of old rose charm (fragrance and flower shape) with the health and repeat-blooming qualities of modern roses, making them a gardener's favorite for their beauty, fragrance, and reliability.

Rosa 'Princess Anne'

- <u>Use</u>: The young flowers are deep pink, almost red, fading to pure rich pink. The rather narrow petals are unusually substantial, with a hint of yellow on their undersides. Held in large, fragrant clusters, they are produced with remarkable freedom. A particularly healthy variety; it forms a bushy, upright shrub with thick, succulent, highly polished foliage. Named for Her Royal Highness, the Princess Royal.
- Exposure/Soil: Full preferred. They must have well-drained soils, so if you have red clay you must amend it. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Keep water off the leaves (no sprinklers/ don't water leaves.)
- **Growth**: Grows to 4' tall and 4.5' wide.
- Hardiness: Zone 5-11, Shrub
- *Foliage:* Deciduous. Foliage is dark green and disease resistant.
 - **Flower:** Flowers are deep pink, almost red, with 85 petals, and features clustered blooms with a tea rose fragrance. She blooms in flushes throughout the season with narrow petals and a hint of yellow on the underside. Excellent repeat flowering.
