## Rosa 'Queen Elizabeth'

- Use: Queen Elizabeth® is one of the most widely grown rose in the world and it's easy to see why. Her pink 3-4" blooms have 38+ petals borne singly and in clusters with a cupped, high-centered form. She is as consistent, steady, and strong as the monarch for which she is named. We recommend her in beds and borders as a hedge or a stand-alone, eye-catching centerpiece of your garden or the back of the border.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Full to part sun. They must have well-drained soils, so if you have red clay you must amend it. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Keep water off the leaves (no sprinklers/ don't water leaves.)
- <u>Growth</u>: Grows 4-6' tall and 3-4' wide. It can be grown as a climber; trained against a wall, up a pillar or through an obelisk; or even grown as a tall hedge.
- Hardiness: Zone 5-10 Climber or Shrub
- Foliage: Deciduous. Foliage is dark green and disease resistant.
- **Flower:** Upon blooming, Queen Elizabeth opens in large, silver-pink blooms with a perfect high center, borne on long-stemmed clusters. Repeat flowering, 40 petal count, and moderate fragrance.
