## Rosaroma® Rose



Moving outdoors: If you would like to move your Rose outdoors for the summer, wait until the danger of frost has passed in spring, then gradually acclimate your plant to conditions outside over a week's time. Set the pot outdoors in a sheltered, lightly shaded spot, increasing the exposure to sun and wind each day. Check the moisture of the potting mix and water thoroughly if it's dry. Once acclimated, keep your plant in full sun for the summer

## Rosa 'Rosaroma Series'

- <u>Use</u>: The new scented rose from Kordes Roses and Rosa Danica is the result of many years of selective breeding and crossbreeding work. As lovely as their full-size relatives and despite their small size, these roses are extremely hardy. Incredibly versatile, adding natural charm and romance to spaces that are impractical for full-size roses. They grow moderately quickly and work well in a border or as garden edging. They're also especially nice as specimen plants in containers, where they can be brought closer to eye level and truly be seen and appreciated.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full to part sun (but more than 6+ hours). During the winter they prefer well-drained soils. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Always water under the leaves (no sprinkler if outdoors) and good air circulation will prevent fungus issues.
- **Growth**: Moderate grower, 6-12" tall and wide.
- <u>Hardiness</u>: Zone 6-9; Shrub Plants you buy leafed out in winter you are best to wait until after last spring frost to plant outdoors.
- *Foliage:* Deciduous. Glossy green foliage.
- **Flower:** Rosaroma roses come in feminine shades of demure pastels in this series.
