## ***Rosa x 'Sunorita'***

- **Use:** Sun-drenched color on an easy care rose! In 5+ years of the breeder trialing it, no one could walk by Suñorita rose without saying, "What IS that?!" So once it met their standards for disease resistance and non-stop blooming, they are now offering it to the public. The elegant, classically shaped buds are red orange and open to reveal a soft orange bloom made up of several dozen petals, perfectly shaped to form a classic rose "bowl." As the blooms age, they develop a golden tone. Perfect for borders, hedges, specimen or container gardens,
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full to part sun. During the winter they prefer well-drained soils. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Grows 3-4' tall and wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5a-9b; Shrub
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Dark, glossy green foliage. Exceptionally disease resistant.
- **Flower:** The classic rose look with flowers that start off shades of orange and as they fade transform to shades of peach and golden yellow. Rose blooms off of the new growth so if trimming is desired it can be done in the fall or spring.
