This fragrant beauty does have some particular needs so research further before planting. Good for cutting. Fragrant. Deer resistant.



Syringa pubescens patula 'Miss Kim'

- **Use:** This upright, compact lilac blooms later than others, extending the season with deep purple buds that reveal clusters of highly fragrant, lavender blue flowers. Hardy, yet performs in southern regions, with excellent powdery mildew resistance. Great for border accent or mass planting.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Requires well-drained soil and full sun. Prune to shape right after blooming. Apply a controlled release fertilizer in the spring. This variety has good powdery mildew resistance. **MUST HAVE GOOD DRAINAGE! NO RED CLAY!**
- **Growth:** Grows slowly, especially during the first three years, but eventually reaches a height of 6 to 8 feet.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4-9; Shrub
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Foliage is burgundy-tinged in fall.
- **Flower:** Resembling a bouquet of purple to white flowers, produces flowers consistently on the previous year's wood growth. It usually starts to bloom three to five years after planting.
