- <u>Use</u>: Yes, you have space for a delightfully fragrant lilac! Baby Kim lilac is our smallest lilac to date, but boy, does it pack in a lot of flower power. Enjoy glossy, dark green foliage, an abundance of fragrant purple blooms that don't fade to white, and a useful rounded habit that fits into just about any sunny spot. It brings all the joy of lilacs into a neater, tidier package so you can enjoy this classic flowering shrub no matter how much or how little space you have. Plant it lining a walkway, under windows, as a low hedge, or anywhere you want color and fragrance with minimal care.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Requires well-drained soil and full sun (with some afternoon shade). Prune to shape right after blooming. Apply a controlled release fertilizer in the spring. MUST HAVE GOOD DRAINAGE! NO RED CLAY! ALSO NEED TO ADD LIMESTONE TO SOIL TO GET TO pH of 7
- **Growth**: Grows slowly, especially during the first three years, but eventually reaches a height of 2 to 3 feet tall and 3 feet wide. Dwarf habit takes up just a fraction of the space of other lilacs. Only prune right after flowering.
- *Hardiness:* Zone 3a-8b; Shrub They don't like summer heat so we recommend some afternoon shade.
- Foliage: Deciduous. Foliage is burgundy-tinged in fall and disease resistant.
- Flower: Fragrant, dark purple flowers don't fade to white.
