Use: The most fragrant type on the market. It earns its name from its pure purple flowers and deep, true fragrance. Fresh green foliage resists disease and keeps the plant looking good even when it's not in bloom. Warm climate gardeners should especially take note of Scentara Pura lilac: it requires less chilling than other lilacs, so performs better when winters are mild. Plant Scentara Pura lilac on its own or as a hedge. Just be sure to put it somewhere that you can enjoy its amazing fragrance!



- Exposure/Soil: Full sun, but a little afternoon shade beneficial to protect from Classic heat. Require well-drained soils - wet conditions will lead to root rot which can lilac kill them. Plant only in areas that are not soggy, and do not add anything to fragrance the soil when you plant a lilac. Prune to shape right after blooming. Apply a with controlled release fertilizer in the spring. This variety has good powdery mildew resistance. MUST HAVE GOOD DRAINAGE! NO RED CLAY! ALSO vigorous, NEED TO ADD LIMESTONE TO SOIL TO GET TO pH of 7 modern-
 - Growth: Grows 4-6' tall and wide.
 - Hardiness: Zone 2-8; Shrub
 - *Foliage:* Deciduous. Green, mildew resistant foliage is burgundy-tinged in fall
 - **Flower:** The flower buds emerge a mulberry-violet and open to clear jacaranda purple. Fragrance is outstanding and great as cut flower.
