A golden version of 'Woodwardii' with soft golden-yellow foliage. It has a globe-shaped habit, and is slower growing than 'Woodwardii'. Great as a foundation shrub at the front of the home.





## Thuja occidentalis 'Golden Globe'

- <u>Use:</u> Handsome, bright golden yellow foliage covers this dense, globe
  -shaped shrub, and tolerates full sun exposure without sunburn.
  Thrives in regions with high humidity. Works well as a low hedge and
  in foundation plantings. Use in combination with dark green shrubs for
  a pleasing contrast.
- Exposure/Soil: Preferably 3/4 day sun, with some afternoon shade. While it's a rugged plant, it would appreciate some afternoon shade in our hot summer areas. Must have good drainage, and appreciates slow release fertilizer twice a year. Water if it hasn't rained in 7-10 days first 2 years. Must amend the soil if you have red clay! We recommend our Pro Mix Soil!
- **Growth:** Moderate growing; reaches 4 ft. tall and wide. Can be easily kept 2-3' tall and wide with occasional pruning.
- Hardiness: Zone 3a-8 Shrub
- <u>Foliage</u>: Evergreen. The chartreuse foliage has excellent year-round color retention. However, older interior foliage may shed as part of a normal renewal cycle in fall.
- **Flowers:** Neither the flowers nor the fruit are ornamentally significant.
