Thuja occidentalis 'Janed Gold'

- **Use:** A tight, pyramidal-columnar form with shiny, bright gold foliage which gets more golden with sun and heat. Arising as a branch sport off the cultivar 'Gelderland' comes this fantastic brilliant gold Western Redcedar. In over 8 years of evaluation, not one reversion has occurred. Thuja gets more golden with more sun and hot temperatures and holds the golden color in winter. A great sub for Leyland Cypress (that usually gets into power lines)
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full to part sun. Water regularly- weekly, or more often in extreme heat. Needs less frequent watering, once established.
- **Growth:** Stands 8-20 feet tall with a width of 4-6 feet, perfect for use as a specimen or to create privacy hedges and screens.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5-8; Shrub
- **Foliage:** Evergreen. Holds its golden foliage color throughout winter. Hardy, resists winter burn.
- **Flower:** Not known for flowers..

The tight, columnar habit makes this a great specimen or screen for narrow sites. Use as a bold accent plant in mixed borders.
