## Lemon Burst Arborvitae









It can be clipped into formal shapes or a hedge - or left to develop its own character as a rounded/pyramidal, dense, upright evergreen. It has no significant pests or diseases, and this plant is easily grown by anyone, vet it is evecatching and vibrant in every garden. Rich foliage colors bring warmth and interest to the simplest garden.

## Thuja occidentalis 'Lemon Burst'

- <u>Use</u>: Lemon Burst® Arborvitae is moderately sized with broadly conical form and tight habit. This evergreen thrives in warm climates, does equally well in cold climates, and is resistant to Passalora/Cercospora needle blight. Yellow new growth keeps its color even when grown in full sun. In cool climates during winter, the foliage takes on lovely orange tones. Lemon Burst® is a great choice for year-round color and stunning winter interest.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full to part sun. During the winter they prefer well -drained soils. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Once established needs only occasional water.
- <u>Growth</u>: Grows at a moderate rate in a broad-pyramidal form 4-6' tall and 3-4' wide.
- <u>Hardiness</u>: Zone 4-8; Shrub; May need some protection from summer heat. Location will be key on this specimen.
- **Foliage:** Evergreen. Lemon yellow foliage in spring that deepens to orange yellow in winter.
- Flower: Not known for flowers..
