

Tom Thumb Arborvitae



Foliage is very dense, and consists of nice green sprays which hold their color very well through the winter - minimal bronzing, if any, in cold weather. Holds a nice green color year round better than any other small sized globe Arborvitae.

Thuja occidentalis 'Tom Thumb'

- **Use:** This arborvitae variety is semi dwarf, and globe shaped in habit. Makes a great little accent plant, or can even be used as a lower growing hedge when planted about 2 feet apart. Very hardy - excellent disease resistance and vigor for a semi dwarf variety. A favorite among the dwarf / semi-dwarf Arborvitae varieties we grow. Just a good, all around variety.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full to part sun. During the winter they prefer well-drained soils. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Once established needs only occasional water.
- **Growth:** Grows 2.5'-3.5' tall and 3'-3.5' wide
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-9; Shrub;
- **Foliage:** Evergreen. Good bright clear medium green color all year long. Little, if any, bronzing / discoloration observed here at our nursery year after year. Classic thuja type foliage is very dense, requires no pruning to maintain shape.
- **Flower:** Not known for flowers..
