

Spring Grove Arborvitae



Selected for its superior winter color and hardiness. It maintains a dark green, glossy color even in Midwest winters, and has survived -25 degree temperatures. The tight pyramidal habit works nicely in landscape designs, and its hardiness and deer resistance makes it a good choice for many suburban locations, especially for creating fast-growing privacy screens.



***Thuja plicata* 'Spring Grove'**

- **Use:** Fast growing, cold hardy Arborvitae. Excellent winter color. Good for screens. Deer resistant.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full to part sun. Prefers moist, well drained, fertile soils. Adaptable to a range of pH. Best if pruned in late fall. Medium moisture. Often found in the wild on moist flats, slopes, banks of rivers and swamps, even found in bogs. Evergreen shrub. Fertilize in early spring by applying a slow release fertilizer specialized for evergreens. Follow the label for recommended rate of application.
- **Growth:** Stands 20-30 feet tall with a width of 12-15 feet, perfect for use as a specimen or to create privacy hedges and screens.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3a-8; Tree, Shrub
- **Foliage:** Evergreen. Holds its dark green foliage color throughout winter. Hardy, resists winter burn.
- **Flower:** Not known for flowers..
