- **Use:** Yardline® viburnum does pretty much everything! It manages to be handsome, useful, and easy to care for all at the same time. It's filled with glossy evergreen foliage, providing a steadiness you can use as a hedge or backdrop to other flowering plants in the border. You'll get spring flowers and red fall fruit, and quite a lot of it thanks to a 12 foot tall max height. It's very drought tolerant once it gets established and remains handsome with no trouble from pest or disease. Thanks to a very narrow, but tall habit, it makes a very handsome hedge. Breed is Dr. Tom Ranney from NC State.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full to part sun (best). Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Tolerant of all soils and positions as long as it is not too dry.
- **Growth:** Grows 6-12' tall and 3-4' wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 7a-9b; Shrub
- **Foliage:** Evergreen. Glossy, green foliage.
- **Flower:** Striking white flat-topped, umbel-like, and mildly fragrant flowers that appear in the spring. Red berries emerge in the fall, attracting birds & other wildlife.
