

Little Sango Japanese Maple



The addition of a Japanese Maple to your property is known to increase the value of your home due to their popularity.

Acer palmatum 'Little Sango'

- **Use:** This compact version of 'Sango Kaku' is a rare cultivar that offers unparalleled winter interest. A well-branched habit and moderate growth rate make the scarlet bark on the young branches look especially vibrant.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Prefers morning sun with a little afternoon shade in the South to prevent leaf scald in late summer. Water regularly, when the top 3 in. of soil is dry. Will not tolerate soggy or extremely dry soil.
- **Growth:** Slow growing in an upright habit; reaches 15ft. tall and 12' wide in 15 years.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5a-9b, medium-sized tree
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Starts out with chartreuse leaves in spring which transition to a dark green during the warmer months and then glow orange with red edges during the fall.
- **Flower:** An abundance of flowers each spring that produce a multitude of seeds – called 'samaras'. The samaras hang down as little ornaments which adds to the overall look of this beautiful maple.
