- **Use:** It is considered a native tree and viable across much of the US. Despite the beautiful color of the bloom, valuable contribution to wildlife, and low maintenance...this plant is becoming increasingly difficult to find in nurseries. We believe it should be used more and more in the Residential Garden.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full sun-shade. will thrive in multiple soils and once established is drought-tolerant
- Growth: Grows 10-20 tall and 10-20'vwide.
- Hardiness: Zone 4a-9b; Tree/ Large shrub
- Foliage: Deciduous; Deep green foliage remains on the tree until the heat sets in...about mid to late June. The shrub or tree then becomes deciduous until the next spring.
- Flower: Multiple brilliant red trumpets about 2" long clustered on 8 to 12" red stems begin the show in early spring. The blooms are held erect in the sun. The blooms are often spent after 4 weeks or so and tan pods begin to develop. Seeds develop inside of the pods to protect them from the squirrels and larger birds.
