

Pindo Palm



Butia capitata

- **Use:** Stately, temperate climate palm with 3 feet long gray-green to silvery green arching leaves. Striking form includes a stout, thick trunk with bold foliage sprays from the top. Looks great in large containers and since they grow slowly they are low maintenance!
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full to partial. Excellent for any soil type except wet soils. sun. Once established needs only occasional water.
- **Growth:** Slow grower up to 20 feet tall and as wide.
- **Hardiness:** 7b-10, Shrub
- **Foliage:** Evergreen; In very cold winters they may yellow a bit, but will green up with warmer weather.
- **Flower:** In the warmer zones, 3 to 4 feet long creamy yellow to reddish flower clusters produce a sweet, edible fruit called pindos.
