

Hortsmann Blue Atlas Cedar



Makes an attractive, small tree with considerable presence for the smaller garden.

Cedrus atlantica 'Hortsmann'

- **Use:** A semi-dwarf selection with dense, icy blue foliage on a gracefully branching compact form. The architectural, irregular outline provides great year-round landscape interest. Add to evergreen borders for both form and foliage contrast. Blend into cold hardy islands with unique shrubs and trees. Ideal for use where space is limited. **This plant is recommended for expert gardeners.**
- **Exposure/Soil:** Prefers well-drained, acidic loam soil, though it can adapt to many other types of soil. For best results plant this tree in full sun, though it can tolerate some shade if needed. It is also a good idea to shelter the tree from exposure to strong winds.
- **Growth:** Slow growing; reaches 8 to 10 ft. tall, 5 to 6 ft. wide, in 10 years.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 6-9; Tree
- **Foliage:** Evergreen. Powdery blue needles borne in whorls or a spiral pattern. Ascending branches covered with tight clusters of bright needles give it an elegant look that is at once full and open.
- **Flower:** Produces a few small cones in the springtime.
