Feelin Blue Deodar Cedar







Great focal point and specimen in parks and small gardens. Give this tree a prominent place to shine in your garden.

Cedrus deodora 'Feelin Blue'

- <u>Use</u>: The lowest of the dwarf cedars, with a unique spreading form that rarely develops a leader. The intriguing form with bluegreen foliage is a wonderful specimen for smaller spaces, rock gardens and containers. Would also make an ideal topiary that may be trained into upright or patio tree forms.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Full to part sun. Follow a regular watering schedule during the first growing season to establish a deep, extensive root system. Watering can be reduced after establishment. Feed with a general purpose fertilizer before new growth begins in spring. Pruning time: winter.
- **Growth**: Reaches 4 to 5 ft. tall, spreading 6 to 10 ft. wide in 10 years.
- Hardiness: Zone 6a-9b; Tree
- **Foliage:** Evergreen. The short needles are an intense glitteringblue color, making it a great contrast plant to other colors like gold or red.
- Flower: 3 to 4" bluish green cones on female trees.
