

Blue Atlas Cedar



Cedrus atlantica 'Glauca'

- **Use:** A bold, pyramidal form with sparkling silvery blue foliage that drapes from the expansive branches. One of the most popular evergreen conifers. A spectacular specimen for large landscape areas that increases in character as it ages. Drought tolerant, when established.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Prefers well-drained, acidic loam soil, though it can adapt to many other types of soil. For best results plant this tree in full sun, though it can tolerate some shade if needed. It is also a good idea to shelter the tree from exposure to strong winds.
- **Growth:** Slow growing; reaches 40 to 60 ft. tall, 30 to 40 ft. wide or larger, with age.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 6-9; Tree
- **Foliage:** Evergreen. Powdery blue needles borne in whorls or a spiral pattern.
- **Flower:** Produces a few small cones in the springtime. Has tight, stubby seed cones that mature in two years.

Uniformly stiff, ascending main branches and spreading branchlets give the Blue Atlas Cedar a full, open appearance. As they age old, elegant specimens get broader and develop a flat-topped form.
