- **Exposure/Soil:** Part shade is best in hot summer climates, but can still grow in full sun. Performs best in moderately fertile soils with regular and consistent moisture. Avoid wet or poorly drained soils.
 - Growth: Reaches 8 to 10 ft. tall and 8-10 ft. wide.
 - Hardiness: Zone 5-9; Tree
- Foliage: Deciduous. The heart-shaped leaves add an uncommon yet delightful texture to the tree. As the new, heart-shaped foliage grows in, it's marked with hues of red. As the foliage matures, it changes into a vibrant green.
- *Flower:* Flowering abundantly in the early spring, this Redbud will be covered in tightly packed, bright pink blossoms, creating a vivid pop of color that will brighten your landscape and your day. Bird-friendly, flat seedpods arrive for fall and winter interest!

Use: This tree is a magnificent addition to your landscape, no matter the size of your space. In spring, it becomes a true focal point as it brightens your landscape with vivid, cotton-candy like flower clusters. And with a compact growth habit, it is also perfect for small spaces - it grows just 8-10 feet tall, while other Redbud varieties can reach up to 20 feet or more. Redbuds are native to the Eastern Coast.
