Lovely pink spring flowers in early spring. An excellent specimen tree that is very disease resistant. Attracts birds, butterflies, and beneficial pollinators.

- <u>Use</u>: Lavender-pink spring blooms are followed by new leaves tinged with orange, becoming bright golden. A unique color for weeping varieties, the foliage holds up well in sun and heat. The tall, narrow form is the perfect accent for small spaces. Redbuds are native to the Eastern Coast.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Best flowering and foliage color in full sun, but because
 they are also understory trees in nature, Gilded Hearts is adept for use as
 wildlife-friendly groupings that cast light shade over seating areas, or in
 rows and odd-numbered clusters for naturalizing along the edge of a
 woods where they get some morning sun! Performs best in moderately
 fertile soils with regular and consistent moisture. Avoid wet or poorly
 drained soils.
- **Growth:** Reaches 8 to 10 ft. tall, 3 to 4 ft. wide.
- Hardiness: Zone 5-9; Tree
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. In spring, new growth is tinged with orange, followed by bright gold leaves that hold up well in the sun and heat.
- <u>Flower:</u> Flowering abundantly in the early spring, this Redbud will be covered in tightly packed, bright pink blossoms, creating a vivid pop of cascading color that will brighten your landscape and your day. Birdfriendly, flat seedpods arrive for fall and winter interest!
