

Pink Pom Poms Redbud



Cercis canadensis 'Pink Pom Poms' PP27630

- **Use:** This *Cercis* offers the most unique, fully double, pink flower clusters, reminiscent of pom poms, that emerge in spring and are followed by large, green, heart shaped foliage. This plant will not produce seed pods. Developed by the JC Raulston Arboretum at NC State University.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full to part sun. Soil should be well-drained. Acidic soil is preferred, though it can tolerate a wide variety of soils. As long as it is properly established, it is moderately drought tolerant.
- **Growth:** Mature plants will reach up to (12.5'h x 12'w in 10 years) eventually 20' tall with a 20' wide canopy. Rounded Vase-shaped tree. Moderate growth rate.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5-9; Small Tree
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Heart-shaped, leaves emerge orange-red turning to bright green.
- **Flower:** Large flower clusters are very showy, rose-pink, double flowers borne in clusters. March-April. Sterile.



Specimen or small groups. Lawns, shrub borders, woodland margins, or along patios. Street tree or lawn tree. Attractive in naturalized settings. Good cut flower for forcing indoors.
