- **Use:** Lucky Leprechaun® Cornus is an extremely free flowering plant. The abundance of white blooms contrasts nicely with the dense, dark green foliage. It is compact in nature, and a plethora of blooms make it a great addition to the garden. It is also resistant to mildew, and in warmer climates, this plant remains evergreen. developed through the breeding and selection work of Dr. Tom Ranney at NCSU and a
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part sun-shade. Best when planted under other trees, but not too deep a shade or poor flowering. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Grows 13' tall and 4-5' wide. Narrowly conical shape is great for tight spaces.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 7-9; Small Tree/Shrub
- **Foliage:** Evergreen; dark green foliage. It is considered to be resistant to Dogwood anthracnose as well as powdery mildew.
- **Flower:** In late spring to early summer this Dogwood is covered in up to 4" wide, ivory colored blossoms centered by a green button and mature to a chartreuse.
