

Silver Dollar Eucalyptus



Eucalyptus cinerea

- **Use:** The Eucalyptus Tree is a fast growing evergreen which originated in Australia. Eucalyptus trees produce an oily sap used in products ranging from cleaning supplies to insecticides. Because the leaf structure of the Eucalyptus Tree is so symmetrical and fragrant, homeowners often cut small branches to bring indoors for decoration. We think they are best used in containers.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full– part sun. Well adapted for wet soil, the Eucalyptus Tree is often used to improve soil with poor drainage by quickly absorbing excess water.
- **Growth:** Fast growing shade tree that has a compact, dense crown 35-40 ft. high and wide with pendulous branches.
- **Hardiness:** **Zone** 8-11; Tree, Need some winter protection.
- **Foliage:** Silver-blue, coin shaped, opposite on the stem and excellent for cut foliage.
- **Flower:** Flowers resemble short white tassels since they are made of numerous stamen with no petals.

Eucalyptus Trees are sometimes called Silver Dollar Trees because of the almost perfectly round shape of some of its leaves.
