

Yates Apple Tree



Small fruit with white skin covered with shades and stripes of dark red. Very juicy with a spicy flavor and great for making cider. Ripens in late fall and keeps well.

Malus pumila 'Yates'

- **Use:** Late fall variety ripens late October. Small, dark red, juicy, mellow, sub-acid. Best keeper. Non-spur. **Please be sure to read the Home Garden Apples article from UGA at our checkout. There is too much information to print here.**
- **Exposure/Soil:** Sunlight, and plenty of it, is a key to increasing fruit production. Pick an area where the trees will be in the sun most or all of the day. The early morning sun is particularly important because it dries the dew from the leaves thereby reducing the incidence of diseases. If the planting site does not get plenty of sun, then you can't expect the best performance from the tree. Well-drained, rich soil. pH of 5.5 to 6.5 necessary.
- **Growth:** Mature height 18-20 ft. Plant at 25 ft apart.
- **Hardiness:** 6-10; Tree.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous.
- **Flower/ Fruit:** The Yates apple tree is a Pollinator. A small red apple that is very firm with dotted skin. The Yates apple has a juicy aromatic flesh with excellent taste. A heavy bearing apple and a good pollinator for most apples. The Yates apple tree is very easy to grow and a favorite for wildlife. Ripens mid-October.
