Snow Fountains Weeping Flowering Cherry





They are the perfect choice for planting in rows along a property border or close to structures like drive-ways or side-walks because they won't take over space. However, with their unforgettable beauty, they are most often used as accent pieces or the main focal point of flowering gardens.

Prunus x 'Snofozam' (Snow Fountains)

- <u>Use</u>: Naturally weeping branches are covered with showy, snow white flowers on this magnificent, compact, hardy specimen for the landscape. Produces very few red-black ornamental fruit in summer. Very disease and insect resistant. A beautiful small yard tree. Exquisite in Japanese style or nature inspired gardens.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full to part sun(5-6 hours min). Soil should be well-drained. Acidic soil is preferred, though it can tolerate a wide variety of soils. They are not drought-tolerant, so proper watering is a must.
- <u>Growth:</u> Slowly reaches 8 to 15 ft. tall, 6 to 12 ft. wide in natural form. Top grafted at 6' to contain height.
- Hardiness: Zone 4a-8; Tree
- <u>Foliage</u>: Deciduous. Serrated, dark green foliage has no issue with unsightly shot hole disease, staying neat and clean all season before developing into gold and orange tones in fall.
- **Flower:** As a weeping tree, its cascading branches dip all the way to the ground, giving the appearance of a white or snow fountain when covered with pure white flowers in early spring. Flowers give way to small, sparse, black, inedible fruits.
