

Lemon Button Fern

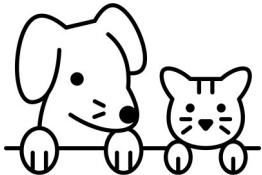


Nephrolepis cordifolia 'Duffii'

- **Use:** A delightful, compact plant, it is the smallest of the Boston ferns and widely used both indoors and outdoors. When grown outside in frost-free areas, it is ideal in shaded beds and mixed container gardens, where it adds dramatic texture. Indoors, the Lemon Button Fern is often used as a houseplant and in terrariums.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Needs a bright (but not full sun & no hot sun afternoon through a window) warm, moist, humid condition with a well-drained soil mix. They will begin to suffer below about 55°F for prolonged periods. Best kept between 70°F and 80°F, with high humidity.
- **Growth:** Slow growing. Two-three feet high and wide with many years of growing.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 9-11, Annual, Houseplant;
- **Foliage:** Its small, golden-green, buttonlike leaflets grow on dark green, arching stems that reach about a foot high and wide at maturity. Crushing or even just handling the fronds can produce a lemony scent.
- **Flower:** No flowers, but spores.
