## Seloum Philodendron



## Philodendron 'Selloum'

- <u>Use:</u> Great for on a patio or semi shady location outside. Also can be used as a houseplant.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Grows well in bright indirect light. In lower light the leaves turn a darker green. Too much light or direct sun burns the leaves or causes the deep green color to fade. likes moist but not soggy soil. During the winter, water less often, keeping the soil barely moist. Do not let plant stand in water in saucer either. Feed monthly during the spring, summer, and fall with a water-soluble balanced fertilizer diluted to ½ the recommended strength. Too much plant food causes excess salt build up in the soil and can cause leaf burn. The leaves on a philodendron selloum usually turn pale green when the plant needs more fertilizer.
- *Growth:* Often spreading 5ft. or more with 2ft.-3ft. leaves.
- *Hardiness:* Zone 11 Annual; Houseplant, must bring inside in the winter or when temps go below 50 degrees.
- *Foliage:* Likes to be misted
- *Flower:* None

Great as a houseplant in a sunny room or as a specimen on patio!
