

Madame Galen Trumpet Vine



Campsis x tagliabuana 'Madame Galen'

- **Use:** Abundant sprays of trumpet-shaped, salmon-red flowers cover this showy vine throughout summer for an extra long bloom season. Creates a dramatic effect covering fences, and climbing arbors. Once established, thrives and blooms best with near neglect.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full sun preferred or at least 6 hours of afternoon sun. Tolerates poor soils. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Rapidly grows 20-30' high. Though trumpet vines show no serious disease problems, they are self seeding which produces suckers making them sometimes aggressive growing vines.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4--9; Vine
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. It produces a compound, odd-pinnate leaves (to 15" long) which are shiny green above and smooth below.
- **Flower:** The brightly colored, red-orange, trumpet-shaped flowers attract hummingbirds from late summer to autumn.



This vine is great for woodland gardens and naturalized areas. Provides quick cover for fences, arbors, trellises, walls or other structures in the landscape. Also may be grown along the ground to camouflage rock piles or old tree stumps. Good vine for hot, dry sites. Needs lots of room. Excellent for hummingbird gardens.
