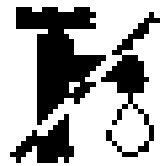


Pinky Clematis

Clematis 'Pinky'

- **Use:** "Queen of the climbers." Clematis are prized for their incredible flowers, most as large as your hand. Will train onto trellises, fences, or arch over doorways. Stunning when used alone or when several colors are mixed. Sepals are light purplish-pink in the center surrounded by pale pink edges. Often touted as the most heavily blooming Clematis, you are sure to be impressed by 'Piilu's' shower of blossoms in late spring and early fall. Excellent for containers and rambling through shrubs.
Exposure/Soil: Full sun–shade (not deep shade); Water regularly, when top 3" of soil is dry. Prefers to have its roots shaded and its flowers in the sun. Use slow release fertilizer twice a year. Once established needs only occasional water.
- **Growth:** Fast grower to 8 feet long, but still compact enough to be grown in a container. It is a member of pruning group 2 (light prune) so a tidy up in late Feb or early March is all that is required.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-9; Perennial, Vine
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Delicate green foliage grows quickly.
- **Flowers:** It produces 7 to 8 inch flowers with a rich magenta bar on white rimmed petals. The blooms appear in spring and summer and the flower color can be lighter or dark depending on growing conditions. This prolific, compact climber offers large flowers in pristine shades of white with pink, over a long season. Supplies beautiful vertical interest to any garden fence or trellis. A great choice for a container or left to meander through shrub beds.
