

# Rosemoor Clematis



**Extremely long blooming - Clematis Rosemoor flaunts deep reddish-purple blooms on both last year and current season's growth, extending the blooms from May to September. Flowers are 5-6" across and center stamens are a contrasting yellow. This premium variety is at the forefront of Clematis breeding - form and coloration are truly breathtaking.**

**Gracefully meandering over fences, trellises or through shrubbery, Clematis supply vertical interest. Every perennial garden should have at least one of these incredible vines.**



## ***Clematis 'Rosemoor'***

- **Use:** "Queen of the climbers." Clematis are prized for their incredible flowers, most as large as your hand. Will train onto trellises, fences, or arch over doorways. Only needs to have its roots shaded and its flowers in the sun. This specimen works well planted in the border, grown over a shrub, or trained over a trellis or pergola. This Clematis is suitable for growing in shaded areas.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full sun–shade (not deep shade); Water regularly, when top 3" of soil is dry. Use slow release fertilizer twice a year. Once established needs only occasional water.
- **Growth:** Fast grower to 7-10 feet long. Pruning Group 3. This group blooms later and from new growth. This group should be pruned in February or March as new leaf buds begin to show low on the plant. All dead material above these buds should be removed at this time. Clean out any old foliage or foliage with mildew at this time also.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-9; Perennial, Vine
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Delicate green leaves.
- **Flowers:** This "rose" colored large flowered clematis has a distinct reddish/purple color with yellow anthers, which contrast spectacularly with the colors of the petals. Its flowers are 5-6" in diameter and bloom on both the previous season's stems and on current season's growth, giving it a flowering period from May-September.
