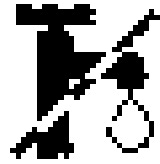


Robert Brydon Clematis



Clematis heracleifolia Mrs. Robert Brydon

- **Use:** Blue-white starry flowers in large clusters weave an exquisite tapestry against the dark green foliage. Petals arch back to reveal prominent stamens that radiate in all directions glistening in the light. Vigorous upright habit can be tied to a trellis or allowed to sprawl and ramble through shrubs or grow as a pleasant billowy ground-cover even in dry dappled shade.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full sun–shade (not deep shade); Water regularly, when top 3" of soil is dry. Use slow release fertilizer twice a year. Once established needs only occasional water.
- **Growth:** Fast grower to 7 feet long. Pruning Type 3 - This group blooms later and from new growth. These should be pruned in February or March as new leaf buds begin to show low on the plant. Also remove all dead material above the buds and clean out any old or mildewed foliage at this time. Bush Clematis. This clematis will die back most of the way and can also be left alone or trimmed back to 3" in early spring to manage its size. If intertwining Clematis, pruning will be easier if you select varieties with the same pruning type.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-9; Perennial, Vine
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Delicate green leaves.
- **Flowers:** Bluish-white 1" flowers in large cluster. Extremely vigorous and very free flowering. Suitable cut flower and we have found to be one of the hardiest. Blooms July – Sept.

Tough vine that bursts forth with showy flowers from delicate foliage!
