

Variegated Creeping Fig



Great for covering up walls or as a dense ground-cover in shade or as a houseplant.

Ficus pumila 'Variegata'

- **Use:** A great houseplant or evergreen vine with small, crinkled, dark green-variegated leaves. Vigorous-growing, clinging, dense branches will adhere to any surface. A handsome choice for climbing walls, poles, arbors and fences. Also lovely used in windowboxes or hanging baskets for interest in shade.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full/part sun; well-draining soil and appreciates slow release fertilizer. Water when top 3 in of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Fast-growing to 25 to 30 ft. long over 5 years. Trim plant to keep it as a tidy houseplant.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 7-9; Vine/Groundcover. We recommend you plant them on a protected wall away from extreme winter cold. We have had ours for 10 years, however, with no problems! Do be aware they cement themselves to a wall so watch for wall damage on stucco and delicate surfaces.
- **Foliage:** Evergreen (Extreme winter ever 10 years or so may cause defoliation. Foliage not safe for pet consumption.
- **Flowers:** Flowers have little ornamental value.
