

Honey Coral Honeysuckle



'Honey Coral' is a twining, climbing vine that will scramble over fences, trellises, and arbors. Honeysuckle can be trained to become a structure. The bright red to orange-red flowers are showy and have an extended blooming season which attracts butterflies and hummingbirds. 'Honey Coral' is not aggressive like the closely related, non-native Japanese Honeysuckle.

- **Use:** a new selection of the eastern North American native red-flowering honeysuckle. It produces masses of red to orange-red flowers over an extended bloom season from spring to fall. Tolerates a wide range of conditions, is long flowering, attracts hummingbirds and butterflies, and when grown on a trellis or arbor, the round, blue-green foliage adds height to the garden.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Prefers full sun to part sun. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry to start. Little water needed once established.
- **Growth:** Fast-growing vine to 3-4' tall. Can also be pruned back to form a dense shrub 4 to 6 feet round.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4-11; Perennial Vine or Shrub
- **Foliage:** Semi-deciduous. Bluish green foliage.
- **Flower:** The bright red to orange-red flowers are showy and have an extended blooming season which attracts butterflies and hummingbirds.
