## 4th of July Rose on Trellis



Climbing roses, like the Fourth of July Rose, are treasured for their ability to cover horizontal and vertical surfaces in the garden and landscape. Hardy and floriferous, climbing roses bloom throughout the summer months.

- <u>Use:</u> This is one of the most eye-catching and beautiful of all the striped roses. Large semi-double 4" blooms (petals10-12) of velvety, scarlet-red striped with white. The long lasting blooms are produced in large sprays and are blessed with a spicy/sweet apple fragrance. The vigorous disease-resistant continually blooming plant is clothed with sparkling, deep-green foliage that sets off to perfection the superb blooms. This climber may also be grown as a free standing shrub rose in cooler climates. All of these attributes add up to make "Fourth of July" an outstanding rose.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Plant your rose in fertile, well-drained soil and in an area with full sun exposure. Newly planted roses require regular watering until established. Water deeply when you plant it and whenever the top 3 inches of soil are dry to encourage deep roots.
- Growth: Grows 10-14 ft. tall with a 6-8 ft. spread.
- Hardiness: Zone 4-10 Vine
- <u>Foliage</u>: Deciduous. Types from this supplier are choose based on disease resistance for the Southeast.
- Flower: Clusters of sweetly scented, velvety red and white striped blooms and attractive, deep green foliage make this climbing rose a standout. An All-America Rose Selection Winner, Fourth of July Climbing Rose produces profuse clusters of flowers and exhibits excellent disease resistance.
